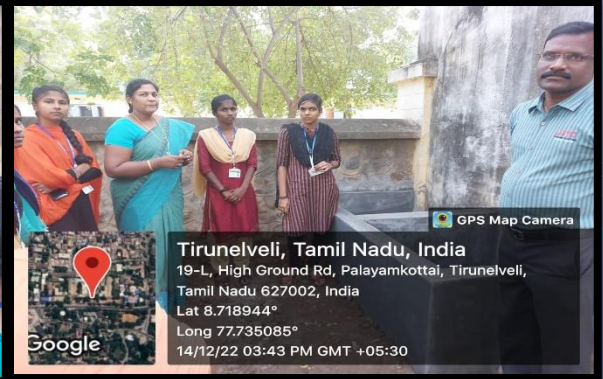

## POSTER MAKING COMPETITION “GIRL CHILD: THIRST FOR RIGHTS”

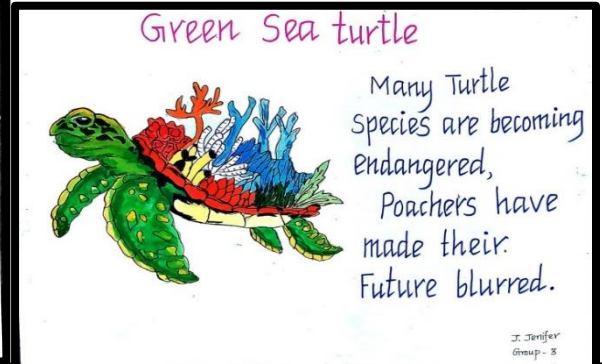
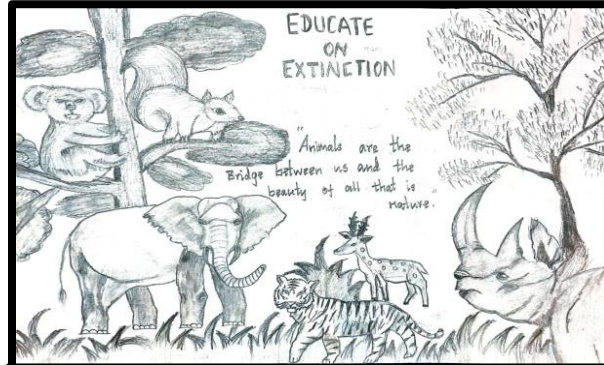

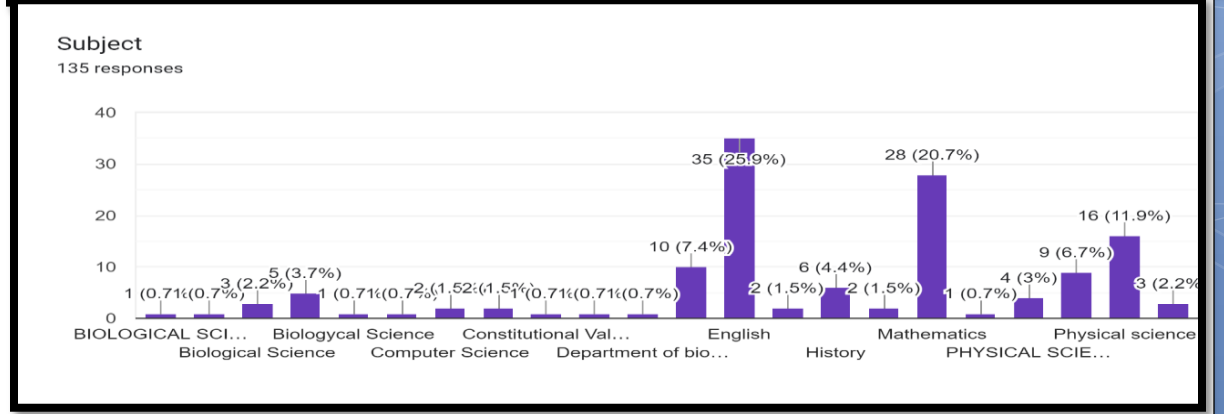
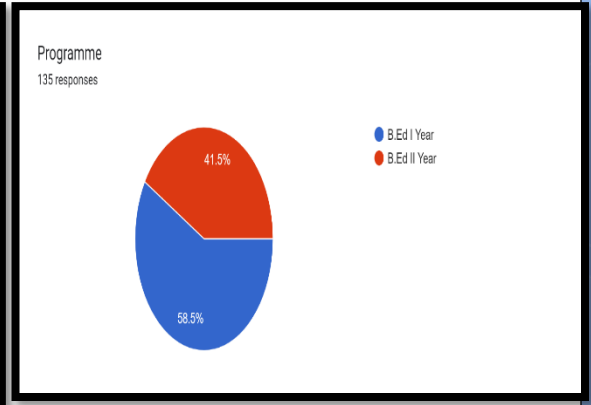
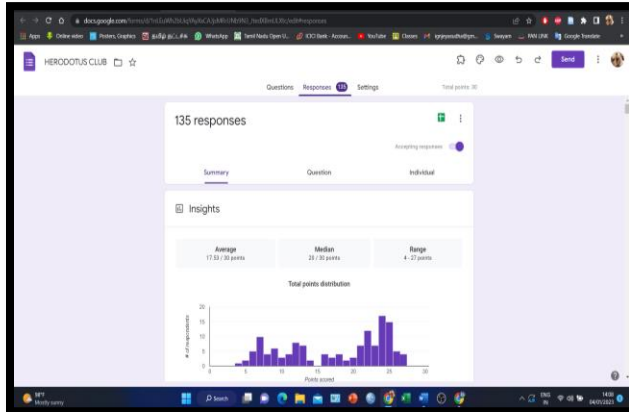
**TRAINING ON “DOLL MAKING WITH COCONUT SHELL ”**

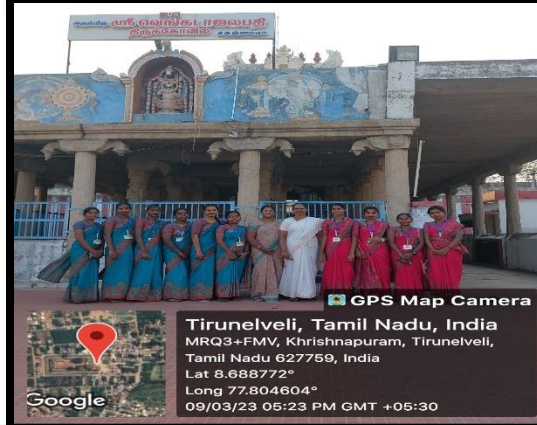
## E-QUIZ ON 'CONSTITUTIONAL VALUES'

## FIELD TRIP TO ADHICHANALLUR AND KRISHNAPURAM

The Herodotus club organized a field trip to the archaeological site Adichanallur and the Dravidian style temple at Krishnapuram on 09.03.2023. The student teachers and staff visited the Adhichanallur archaeological sites and the chief of the excavation site explained about the site clearly. It is a burial ground and there they found iron dagger, sword, skeletons, gold ornaments, copper utensils and black red potteries. The radiocarbon dating on the organic paddy revealed a conventional date of 601 BCE. Then we went to the Vishnu temple at Krishnapuram, which is famous for its Dravidian Architectural style. According to the inscriptions in the temple, the temple was built by Krishnappa Nayak (1563-72). Krishnapuram temple sculptures are noted for their high workmanship and artistic skills throughout the world.





## BRAINSTORMING SESSION ON TAMIL ARCHÆOLOGICAL SITES

The brain storming session on "Tamil Archaeological Sites" was held on 14.03.2023 in the history resource room. Second year history students were the participants of the session. The student teachers shared the important points related to the archaeological sites namely, Keeladi, Kodumanal, Adichanallur, Korkai, Maligaimedu, Mayiladumparai andGangaikondacholapuram. The beginning of archaeological excavations in such areas, the remnants found in the sites, year of the remnants, culture and tradition of the ancient Tamil people and importance of archaeological excavations were discussed in the session.



## VISIT TO DISTRICT MUSEUM

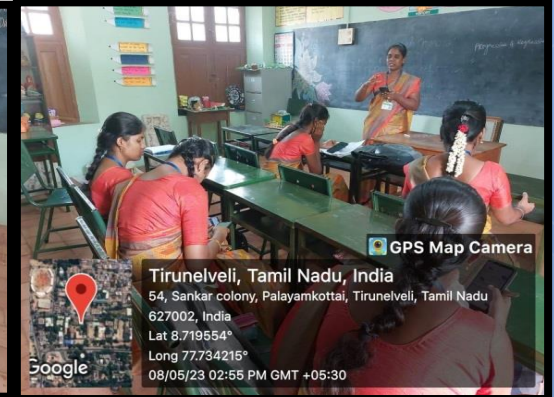
The field trip to Government Museum, Tirunelveli was organized on 10.11.2022. The journey was started at 3.30 p.m. In the museum the student teachers visualized the galleries such as Introducing gallery, Anthropology Gallery, Archaeology Gallery, Umaithurai Gallery, Natural Science Gallery, Painting Gallery and Sculpture Garden. The galleries which contains photographs of temples of Tirunelveli, burial urns of Adichanallur burial site, Paleolithic stone implements like hand axe, flakes, Neolithic stone implements, hunting weapons of tribal people of Pandya Nadu, betelbox, incenseburner, hanging lamps, Pavailamp, Spitton, kendi made of brass used by the people of Karaikudi and Kalamkari paintings oil paintings water colour paintings and patikpaintings which explain the traditional paintings of Tamil Nadu. The supervisor of the museum clearly explained the history and features of the museum.





## THINK TANK SESSION ON “CONSTITUTIONAL VALUES PROMOTING DEMOCRACY”

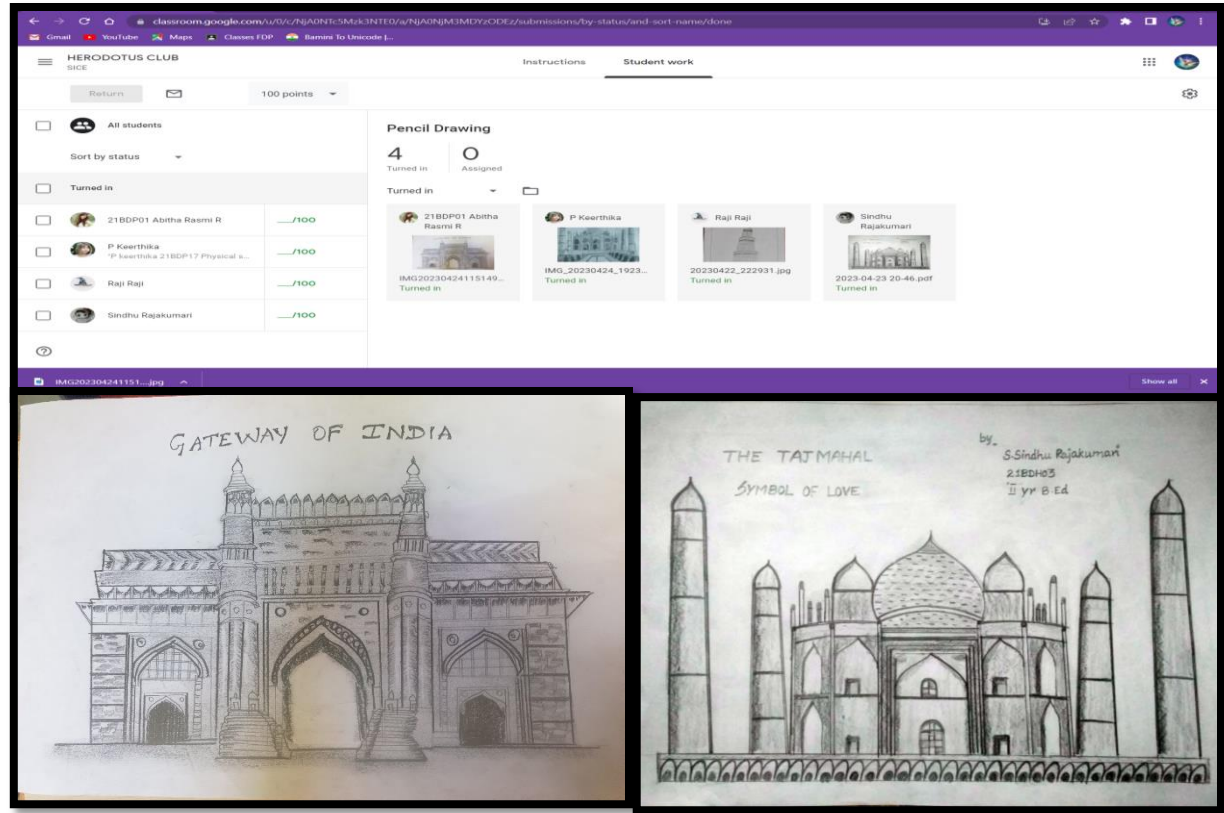

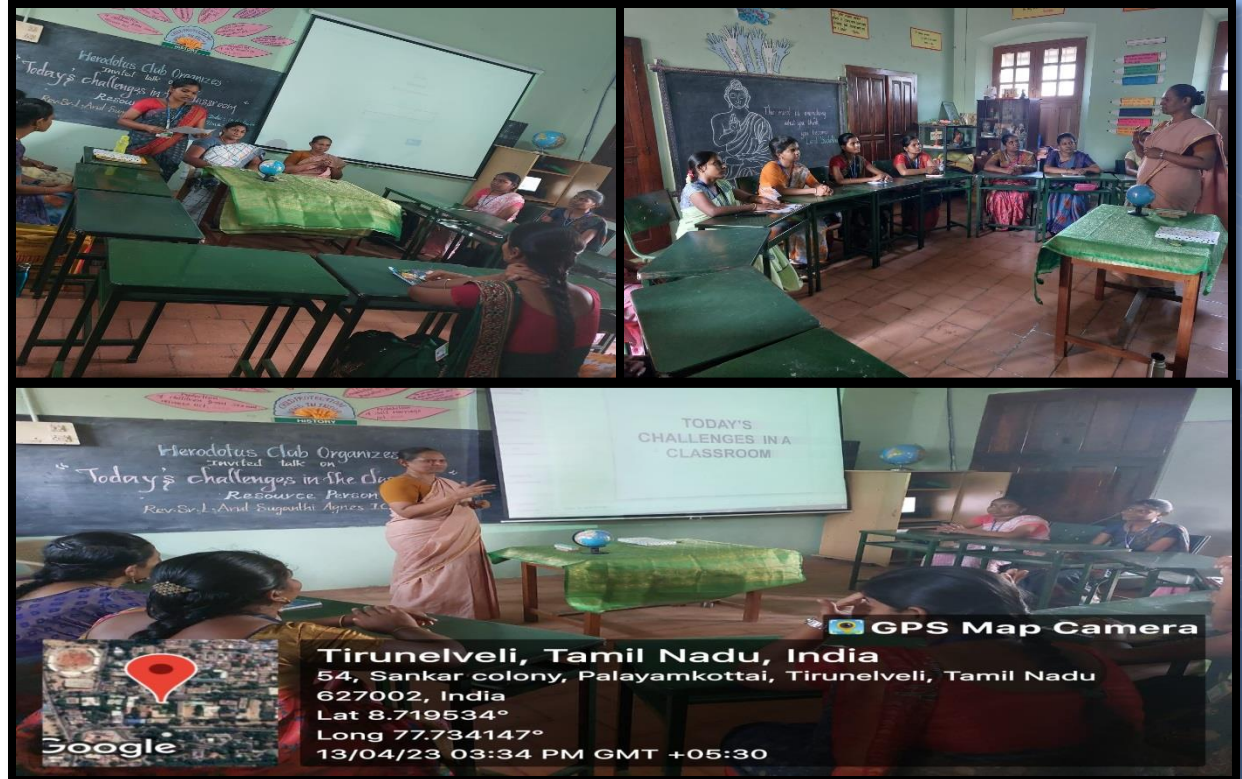
## PENCIL DRAWING COMPETITION : UNESCO WORLD HERITAGE SITES IN INDIA

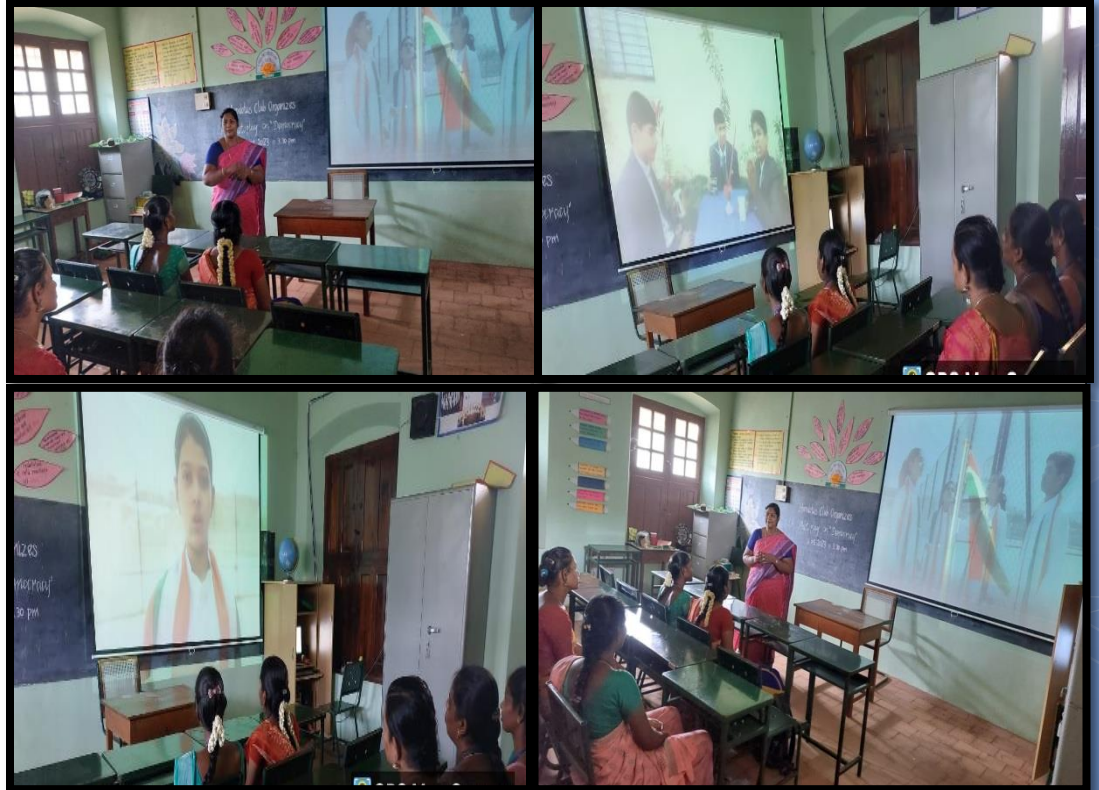
## WORKSHOP ON "INTERACTIVE DIGITAL PRESENTATION"

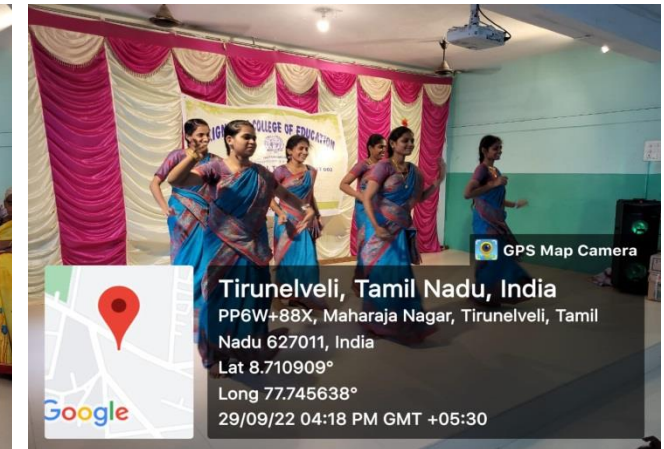
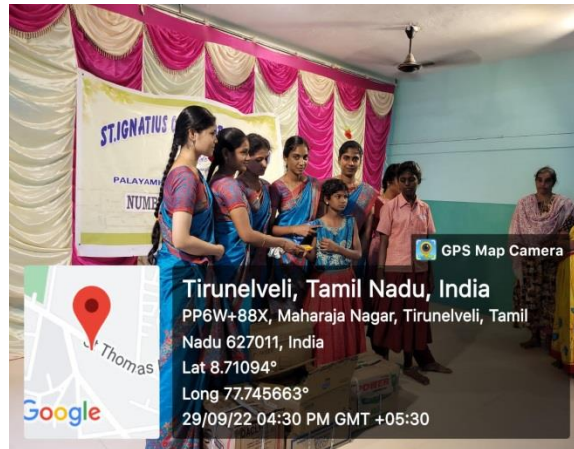




## EXTENSION SERVICE PROGRAMME TO ST. ANNE'S HOME, PALAYAMKOTTAI

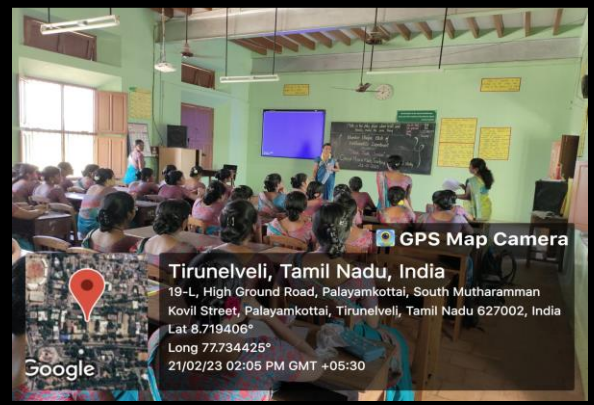
## NATIONAL MATHEMATICS DAY COMPETITION

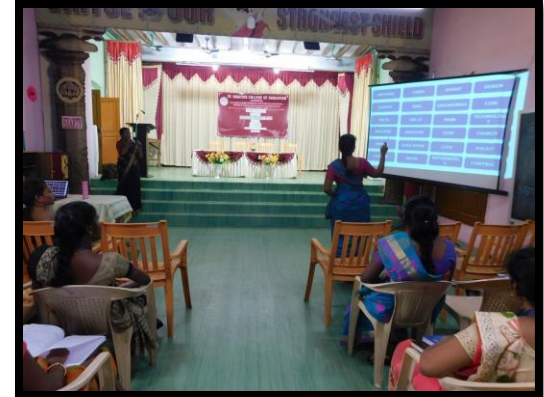




## STEM EDUCATION IN THE LIGHT OF NEP 2020

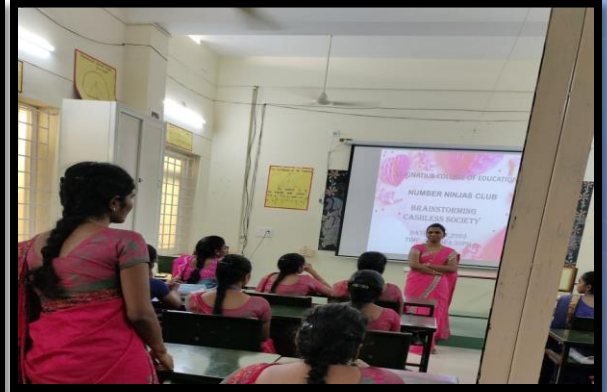

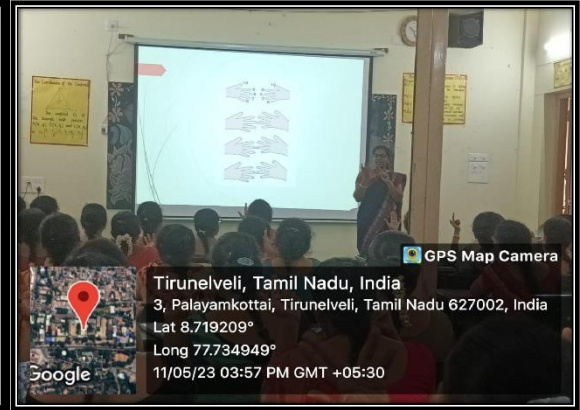
## GROUP DISCUSSION ON “ASSISTIVE DEVICES IN MATHEMATICS EDUCATION”

# EMBELLISH YOUR RECEIPTS

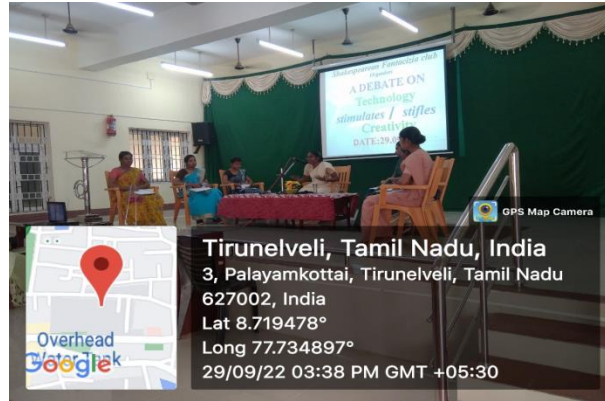

## A DEBATE ON "TECHNOLOGY STIMULATES CREATIVITY OR TECHNOLOGY STIFLES CREATIVITY"

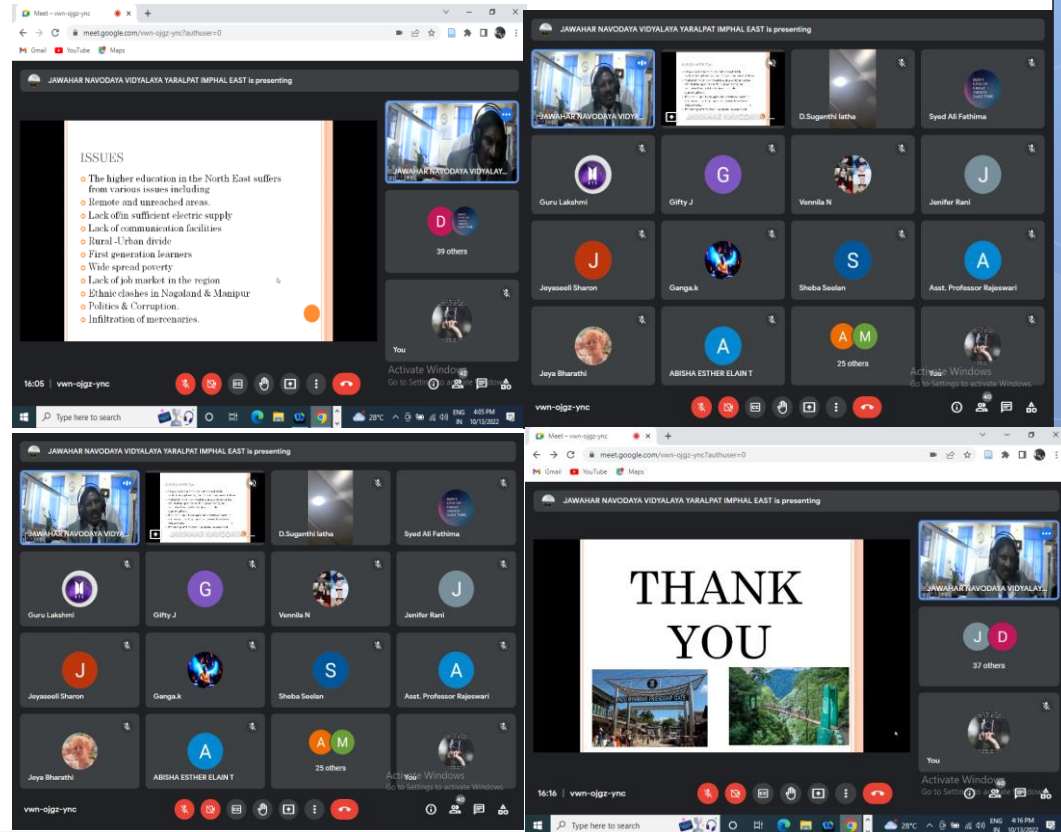

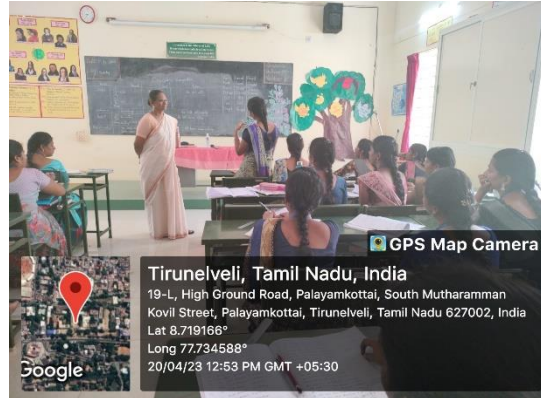

## STEM PARK

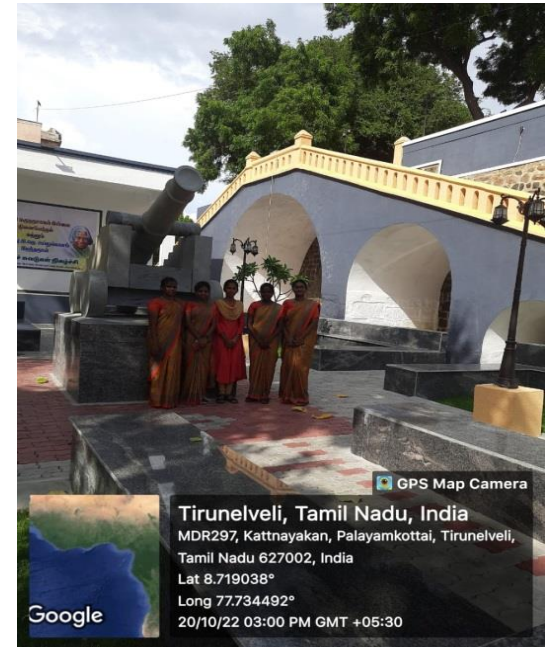
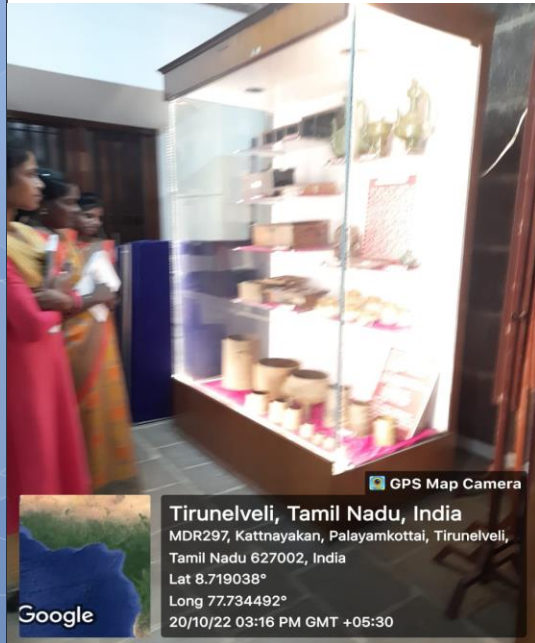

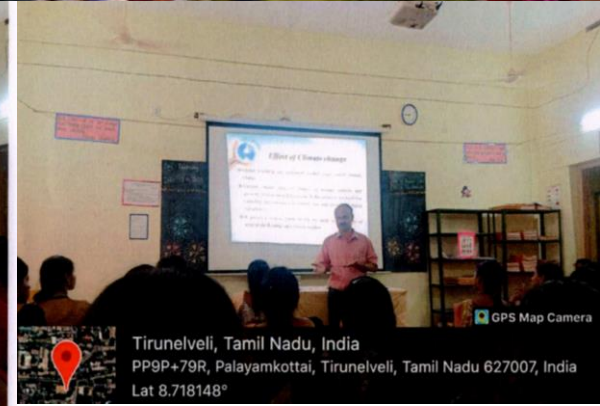
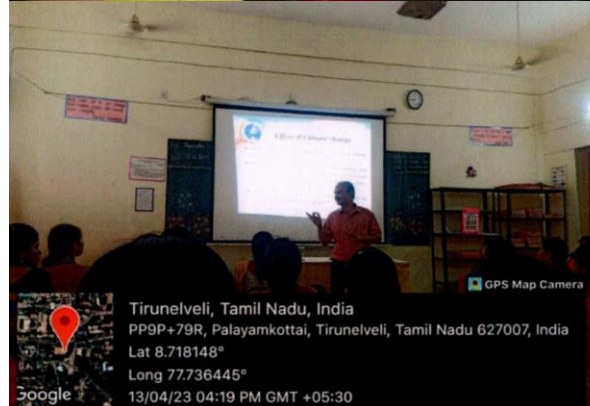
## INTERCOLLEGIATE PHOTO CONTEST THEME : IMPACT OF TIDAL WAVES

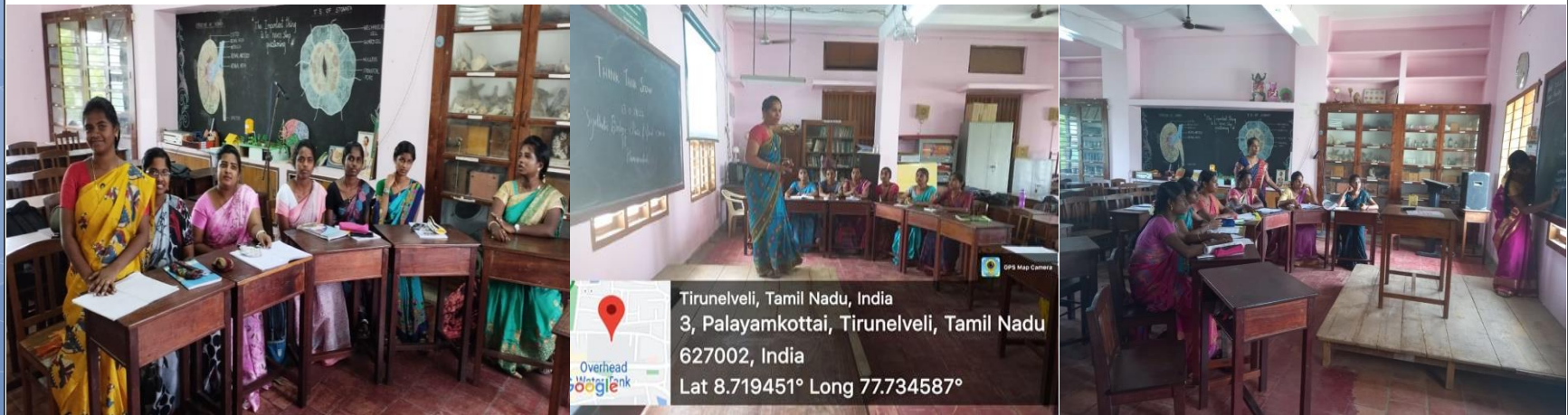

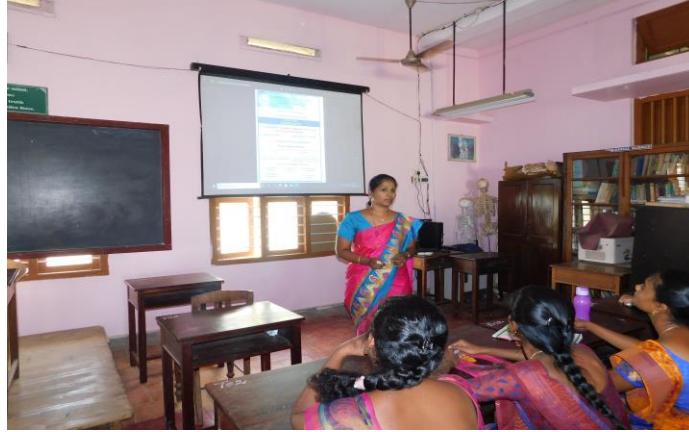

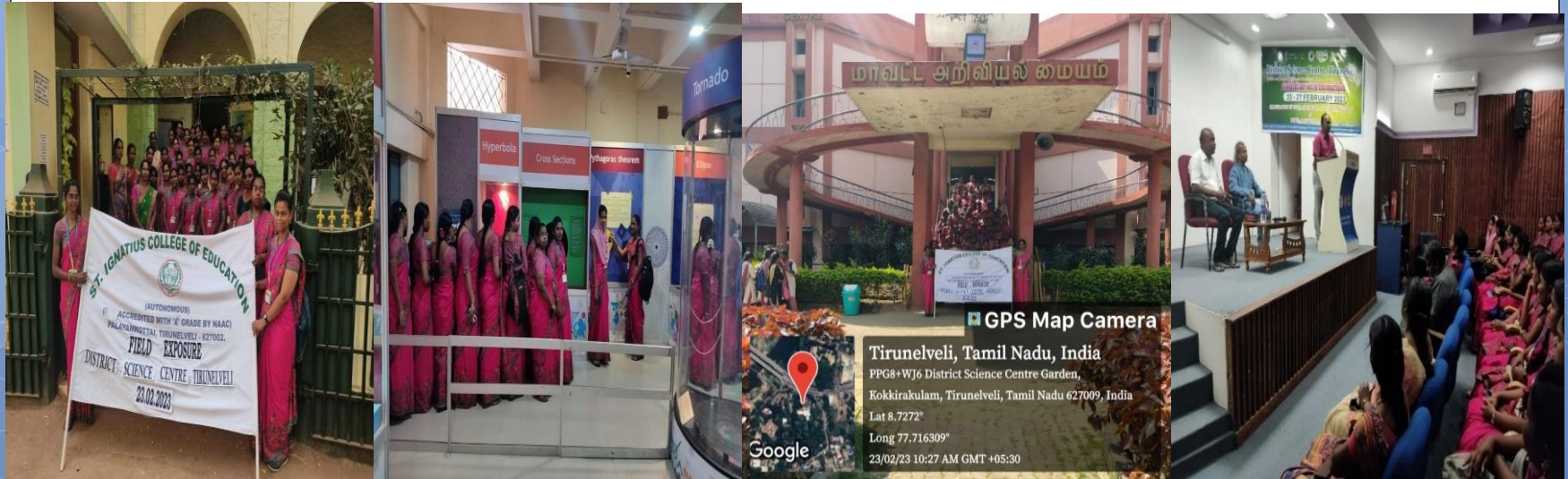
## POSTER PRESENTATION COMPETITION ON “GLOBAL ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUES”

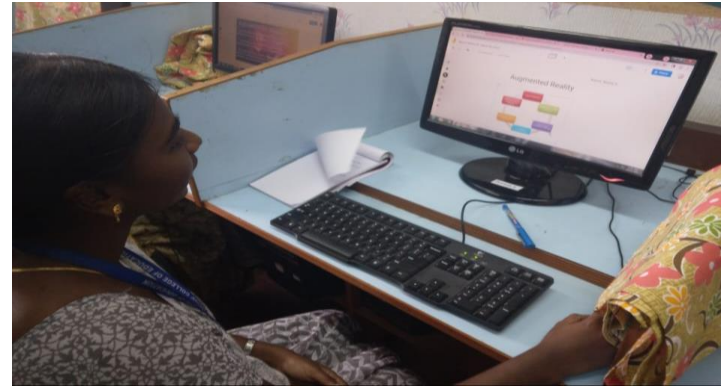
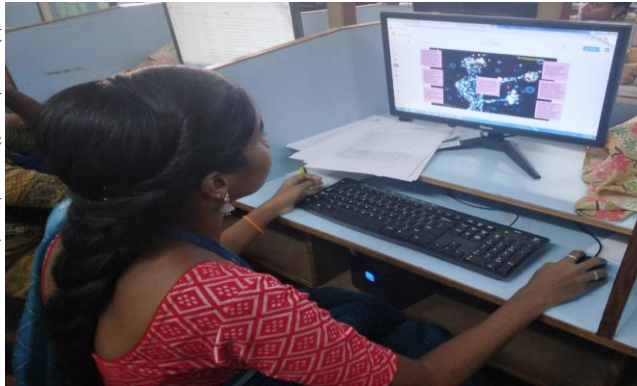
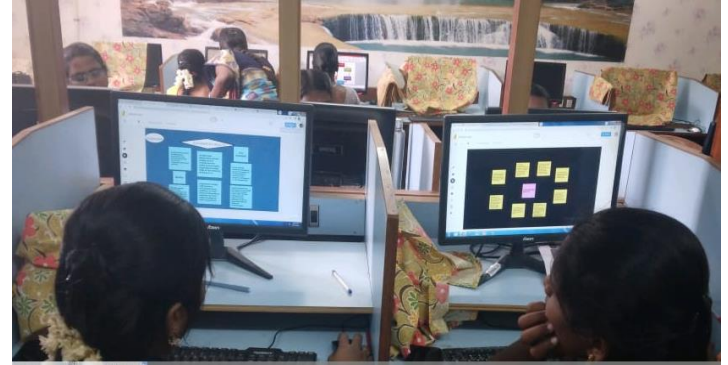
## WORLD BOOK DAY 2023 ESSAY WRITING COMPETITION

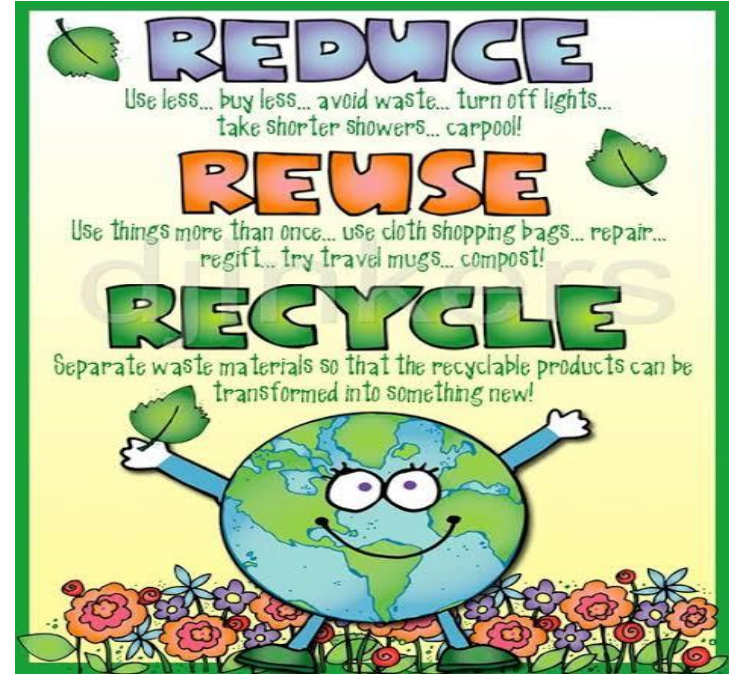

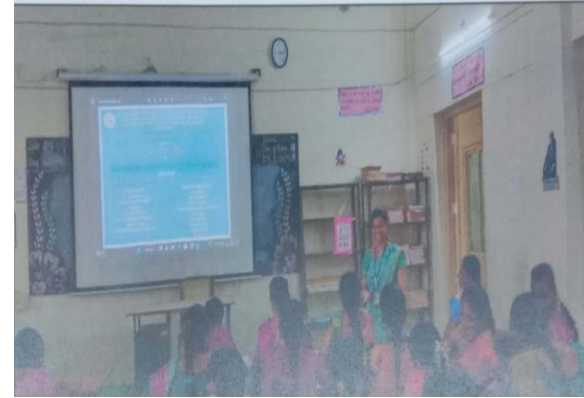

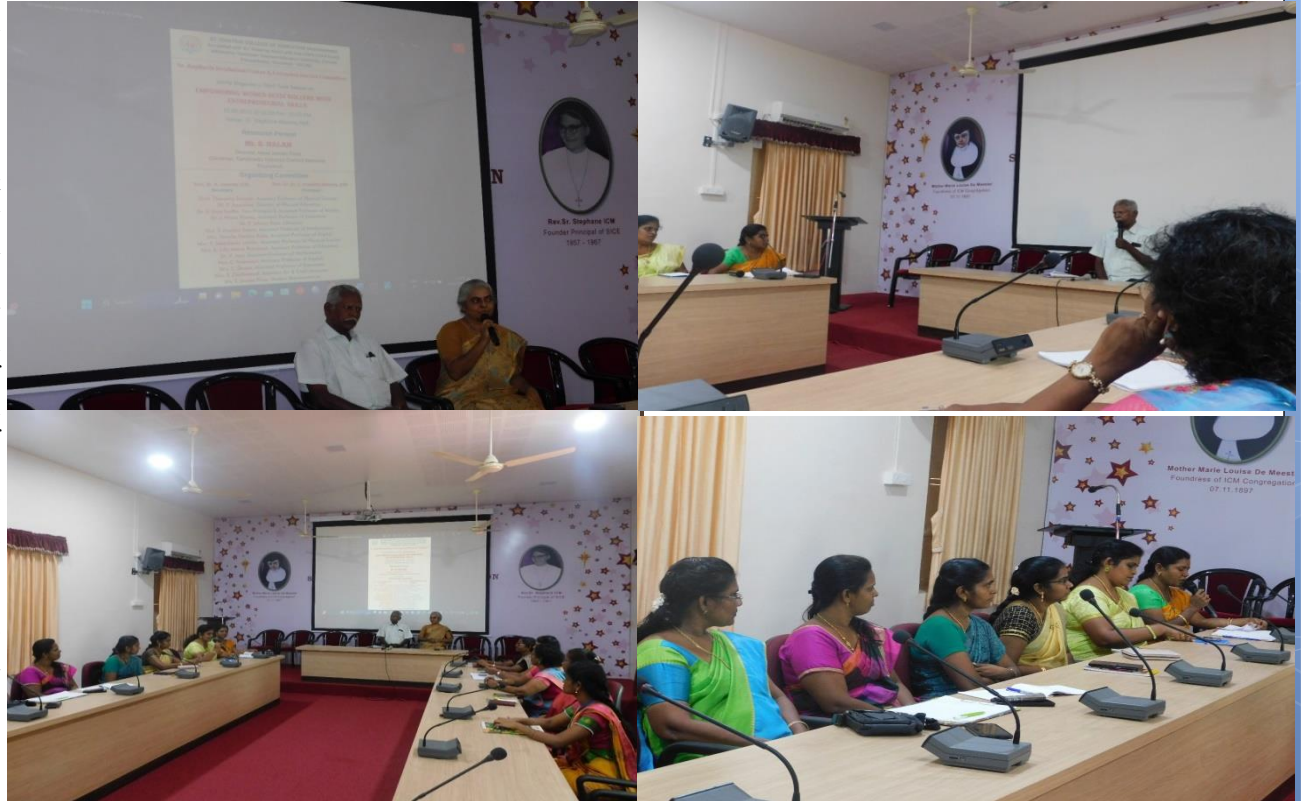
## THINK TANK SESSION ON KNOWLEDGE MANAGEMENT SKILLS IN PRESENT SCENARIO

## AN EXPOSURE TO SXC @100 EXHIBITION 2023

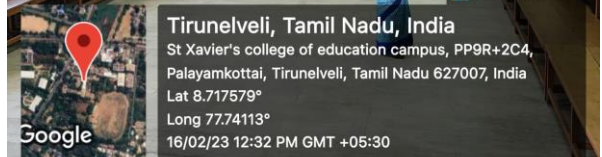
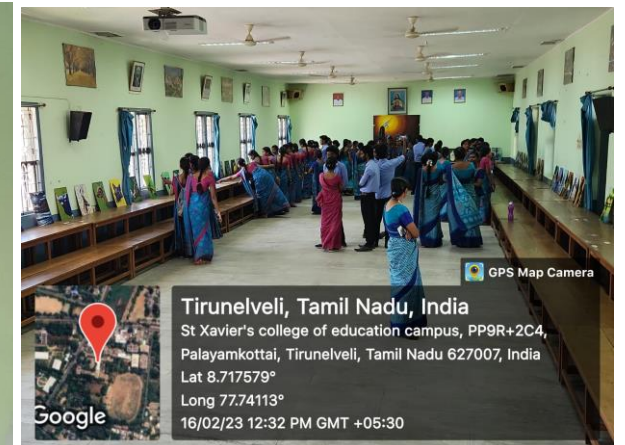
