REPORT

UNNAT BHRATH ABHIYAN ORGANIZED AN CANCER AWARENESS TALK ON THE THEME CLOSE THE CARE GAP & A SCREENING CAMP ON 27.09.2023

RATIONALE:

Cancer is a disease in which some of the body's cells grow uncontrollably and spread to other parts of the body. Cancer can start almost anywhere in the human body, which is made up of trillions of cells. Normally, human cells grow and multiply to form new cells as the body needs them. When cells grow old or become damaged, they die, and new cells take their place. Sometimes this orderly process breaks down, and abnormal or damaged cells grow and multiply when they shouldn't. These cells may form tumors, which are lumps of tissue. Cancerous tumors spread into, or invade, nearby tissues and can travel to distant places in the body to form new tumors.

REPORT:

Unnat Bharath Abhiyan of St. Ignatius College of Education organized a cancer awareness programme on the theme, "Close the Care Gap" on 27.09.2023, for the UBA village people in Paraikulam Village, in collaboration with Nellai Cancer Care Centre, Tirunelveli. Dr. M. Abirami, Medical Officer, Nellai Cancer Care Centre, Palayamkottai, Tirunelveli was the resource person. Dr. Abirami explained the nature of the disease, how does it develop, fundamentals of cancer, types of genes that cause cancer, when it spreads, types of cancer, how to diagnose the lumps and tumors and the treatment for cancer. Dr. Abirami with her medical assistants conducted a screening camp for the village people.

OUTCOME:

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Sixty-nine women and four men attended the screening camp. Two men and one woman suspected for lung cancer. For twenty-seven women, Pap taken for cervical cancer. Six women found high risk of breast cancer. And three found positive.

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



REPORT OF THE HOUSEHOLD SURVEY IN UBA SERVICE VILLAGE PARAIKULAM ON 13.12.2023

RATIONALE:

The Ministry of Human Resource Development (MHRD) launched Unnat Bharat Ahiyaan (UBA) 2.0, which aims to bring a transformative change in rural development through the active participation of higher education institutes with rural communities and the reorientation of communities through research and development. It was launched in February 2018 by the Indian government. In June 2018, the University Grants Commission (UGC) established a Subject Expert Group (SEG) on Curricular Reforms and Educational Institutions Social Responsibility to help UBA 2.0 achieve its goals.

REPORT:

As part of UBA activities, the UBA Committee of St. Ignatius College of Education conducted Village Survey and Household Survey in the UBA service village Paraikulam in Melaputhaneri gram panchayat on 13.12.2023. With this regard, 39 prospective teachers along with the three UBA committee members visited the villages and taken Household Survey. The details regarding respondent's profile, general household information, family member information, migration status in a family, information of government schemes, source of water, source of energy and power, landholding information, agricultural inputs, agricultural produce in a normal year and livestock numbers were collected for Household Survey.

OUTCOME:






OUTCOME:
