With this aim in view, the admission policy is framed as to enfold representatives from the marginal sectors of the society beyond the partitions of creed and community. NCTE recognized the institution as per order No. 2147 Dated 26.11.1996. Every year the college enrolls 200 students in the

B.Ed. course, 50 in the M.Ed. course and 15 in the M.Phil. course. The institution provides Special English, Special Tamil, Mathematics, Physical Science, Biological Science, History and Computer Science as the First Optional.

Our Institution has support services like Library, Language Lab, Computer Lab, Psychology Lab, Technology Lab, Physical Science Lab and Biology Lab. A well furnished hostel provides a meaningful and fruitful residential life for the students. There are sufficient indoor and outdoor gamesfacilities for recreation.

The Development of ICM Educational Apostolate :

We realise that education leads to the individual growth and of the nation ultimately. Therefore deliberate efforts are made by which the students are assisted to satisfy their thirst for knowledge, directing the activities, to make them worthy human beings, equipping them to perform the responsibilities as citizens and members of Indian Society.

In this process the aim of education becomes an un-ending inducement to develop in the students, a vigour for being fully human, to live a meaningful life, by developing real values (human values) which will enable them to liberate themselves and humankind around them.

The aim of the College of Education is to develop in the women trainees a broad vision of interests, a love of knowledge and good taste, to endeavour to induce the students to be interested in their fellowmen and women, to be concerned about advancement of our country and to see themselves as part of the whole world. The ultimate aim is to mould them for the mission of social change and social justice. Our

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preference in admission is toward the poor and for those who are willing to work in the rural areas or wish to work for the benefit of the poor. Keeping the objectives of developing integrated personalities, all programmes are organized in such a way that the students get ample opportunities and life experiences.

The young women are trained to be potential teachers and leaders. While encouraging faith formation, value education, inter-faith prayers and dialogue are organized. Along with the imparting of qualitative education, our student-teachers are prepared with sound philosophy of life. They are made to realise the nobility of their profession and their responsibility in moulding the future citizens of ourcountry.

Admission Policy :

The admission is made open to everyone without distinction of caste or creed. Our preference in admission is for the poor and for those who are willing to work in rural areas or wish to work for the benefit of the poor, and for the first generation graduates.

Teaching Orientation Programme :

Teacher Education is meant for identifying those aptitudes in the student – teachers required foreffective teaching and developing those aptitudes to the maximum. Every academic year commences with the Orientation Programme including training in Italic – Hand Writing, Chart-Writing and Bridge course in English Grammar. During the month of October demonstrations of model lessons are arranged and teachers of the model school provide model lessons to the student-teachers. During the month of October – November the student teachers would have their practice teaching in the model school andthe Macro-Teaching skills would be practiced by them.

Training in ALM :

Higher education not only focuses on teaching and integrated learning, but also in quality research and excellence. Hence the training of ALM is arranged in October in our college premises. The training is given by SSA programme co-ordinators of Tirunelveli Centre. Our students are exposed to the pedagogical environment of the schools where they have 40 days Block teaching in twenty schools in the months of October – November.

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COURSES OFFERED :

I. B.Ed. Course - Two year programme - IV Semesters

Duration : The duration of B.Ed. Degree course of study is 2 years comprises of 4 semesters. The total number of days of an academic year will be 200 working days inclusive of Practice Teaching andSchool / Community based activities and exclusive of Admission and Examination work. The course work will be for 2400 hours. The minimum attendance of student teacher shall have to be 80% for all course work and practicum, 90% for school internship.

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II. M.Ed. Course (Full Time) - Two year Programme - IV Semesters

Duration : The M.Ed. Programme shall be of a duration of 2 years comprising of four semesters including field attachment for minimum of 4 weeks and a research dissertation. There shall be atleast 100 working days for each semester exclusive of the period of admission and conduct of examination inclusive of classroom of classroom transaction, practical and field activity. The minimum attendance of students shall be 80% for theory courses and practicum, 90% for field attachment.
