International Day of Yoga - 27.06.2025

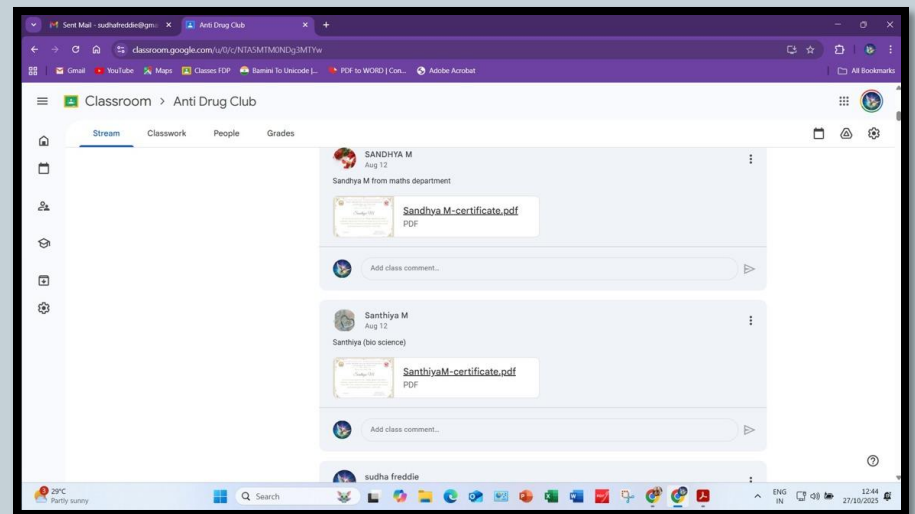
