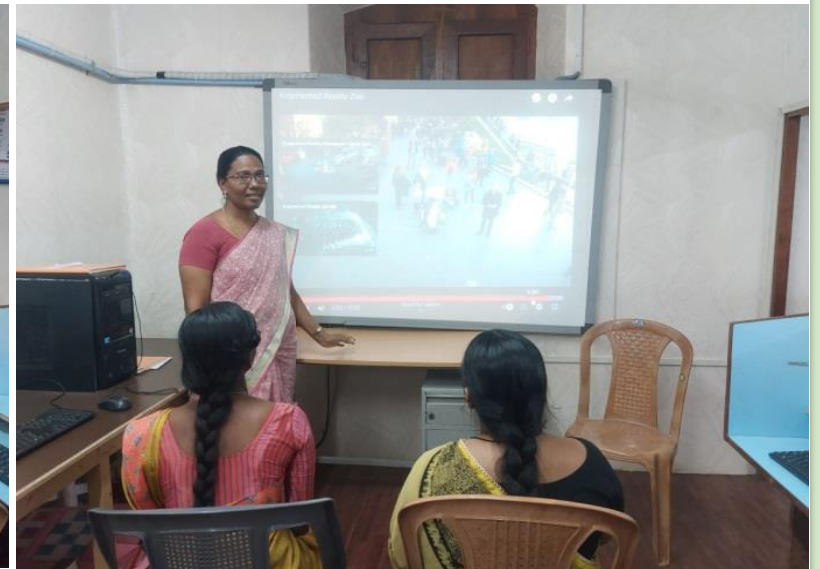
National Level Workshop for Educational Administrators Regeneration for Effective Educational Administration

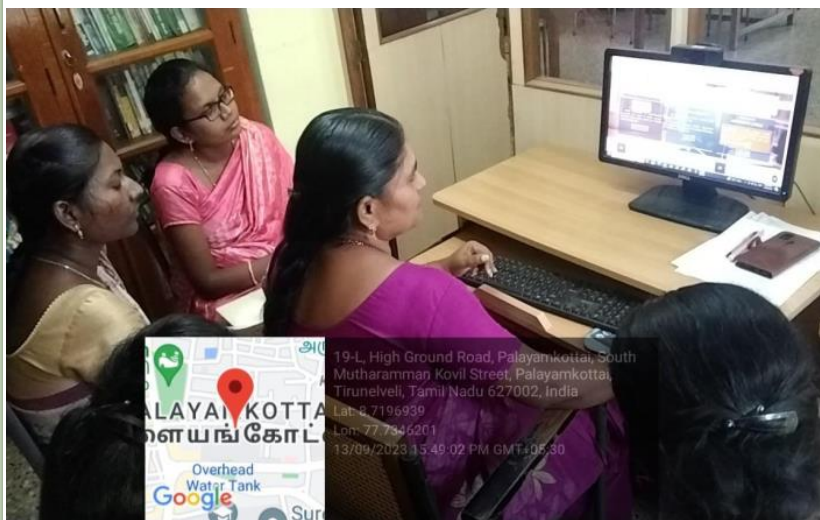
Workshop on Elevating Traditional Teaching with a Digital Touch

He elaborated techniques to formulate hypotheses in research. He cleared all the queries raised by the students and created a thirst towards research in them.



Self-discovery

Making Newspaper Dolls

Sr.Raphaela Incubation Centre Organized Workshop on "Making Newspaper Dolls" on 31.10.2023. Ms.R.Monisha, Entrepreneur and appreciative alumna was the resource person of the workshop. The session started with the motivational speech by the resource person. Students were asked to cut the newspapers and roll into 150 papers. They cut the newspapers into long strips, approximately 1-2 inches wide. Step by step instructions were given by the Resource person. Students rolled strip tightly to form the doll's body and joined it with glue. Students rolled smaller strips for arms, legs and head portion of a doll. Finally the students completed the doll by giving attractive paint to the doll. The student teachers actively participated in the session and made many attractive dolls.



Clay Mural Art

Sr. Raphaela Incubation Centre Organized a Workshop on 'Clay Mural art' on 22.11.2023 at 3.30 p.m. in the Rev.Sr. De Meester conference hall. Mrs. C. Chellammal, Art and Craft instructor shared her expertise as the resource person in the workshop. Workshop started with making a sample design in a Canvas board and students were asked to draw a sample picture using carbon paper. The students were asked to mould it with clay. They rubbed the clay hardly until the texture of the clay became smooth . The students applied the clay in the design paper and painted fully with black colour, then coated with silver colour so that the picture makes aesthetic look. The session made the students to express their creativity by moulding and shaping it into unique forms and structures.



ECO bags production

Workshop on Eco Bags was organized to eliminate the waste produced from single-use, throwaway PP and paper carry bags. These plastic bags aren't biodegradable, meaning they reside in the environment and take up to 1000 years to break down. And even then, the bags only break down to remain as microplastics that accumulate within the food chain. In this regard on 23rd November 2023, Eco production club organized workshop on Eco bags production. Mrs.C.Chellammal, Art and craft Instructor served as the resource person. During the session she gave training for the students to prepare the Eco bags. Student teachers eagerly participated in the workshop and prepare the Eco bags.



Warli Art

Ms.C.Chellammal Art and Craft Instructor of St. Ignatius College of Education (Autonomous) Palayamkottai, served as the resource person for the workshop. The paintings are two-dimensional with no perspective or proportion and are dominated by basic geometric shapes like circles, triangles, and squares. After her instruction the participants were split into groups. Participants worked on Warli Art and felt inspired, creatively engaged and culturally enriched as they learnt about the traditional art form and its significance. They also experienced a sense of joy and accomplishment as they mastered new techniques and created their own Warli-inspired art work. The Warli Art Program developed proficiency in Warli art techniques, including the use of traditional materials and patterns.
